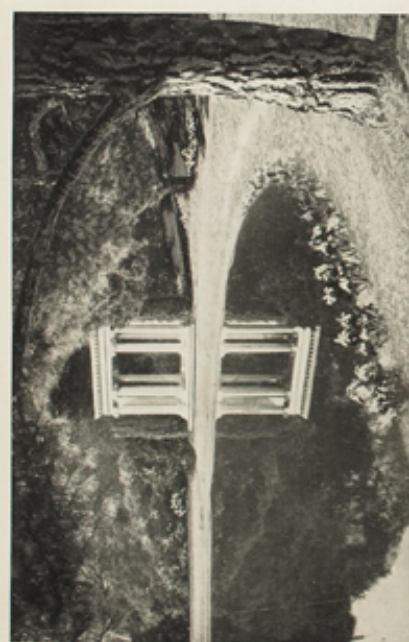

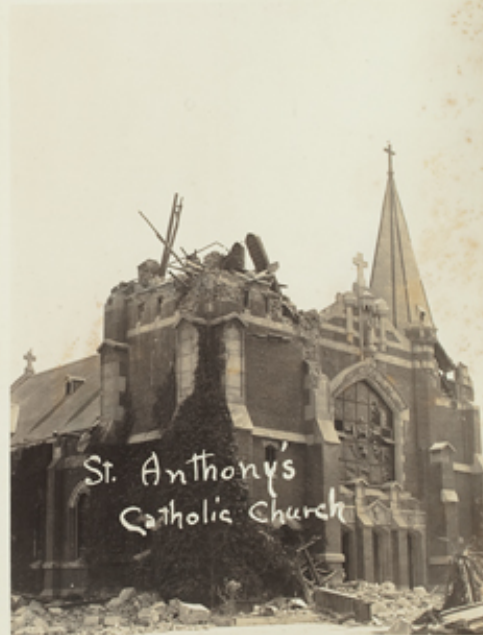

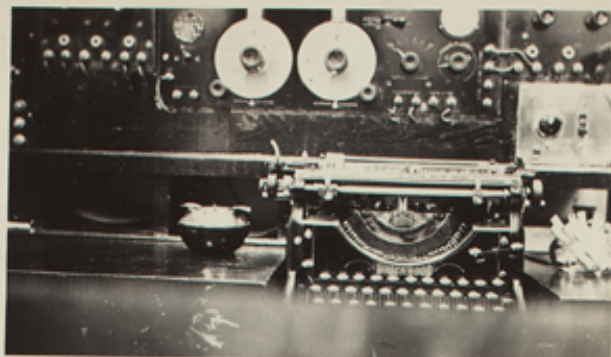

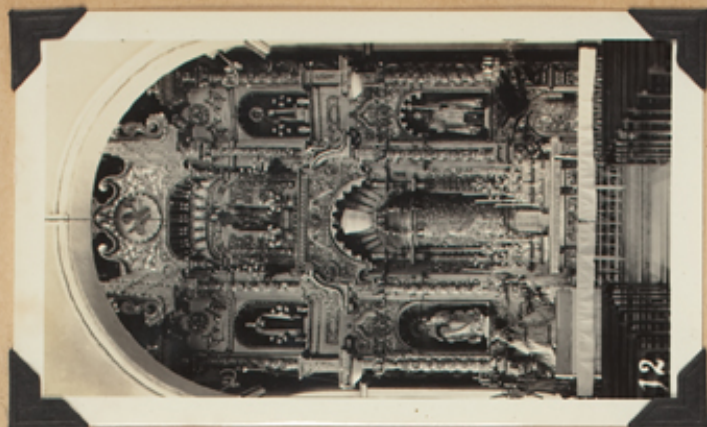

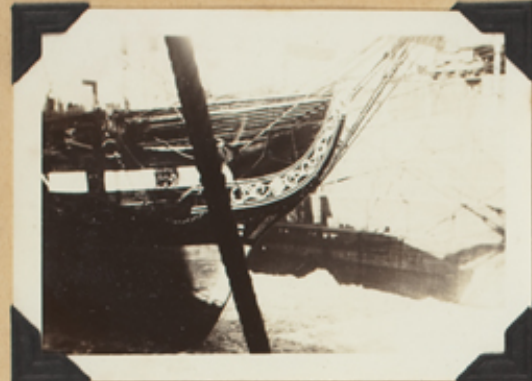

1794-1797 Designed by Joshua Humphreys; built by Colonel George Claghorn at Hartt's Shipyard, Boston, Mass.

October 21, 1797 launched and christened by Captain James Sever.

First Commodore 1799, Silas Talbot.

First Captain Samuel Nicholson.

First cruise under Captain Nicholson to West Indies.

1805-1807 Flagship of Mediterranean Squadron under Commodore Preble, Rogers and Campbell, fighting Barbary Pirates.

1812-1815 Constantly at sea fighting British Navy during war of 1812 - Principle battles during this war were -

- (1) July, 1812 - Escape from British Squadron off New Jersey Coast - Captain Isaac Hull.
- (2) August 1812 - Guerriere - Captain Isaac Hull.
- (3) December 1812 Java - Captain Bainbridge.

## A Sturdy Veteran of the Seas

*Editorial in The Philadelphia Record,*

*Wednesday, April 24, 1924.*

The rebuilding of Old Ironsides is half done, and will be finished in another year and a half or so. When she takes to the seas again she will be a stouter, stancher ship than ever, says Lieutenant Lord, U. S. N., in charge of the work on the old U. S. Ship Constitution, at Charlestown Navy Yard.

Old Ironsides was launched 132 years ago. She has been reconditioned four times. Some may think there can be little of the old ship left. But, like her namesake, the "Immortal Document," she is sturdy enough to stand a good deal of tinkering and still preserve the spirit of youth.

In fact, it is stated that 15 per cent. of the timber in her hull will be live oak that has been there since she was first launched. Of 40 tons of copper bolts in her hull, nearly half will be those furnished (it is believed) by Paul Revere, in 1776.

"Aye, tear her tattered ensign down," Oliver Wendell Holmes sang when it was proposed to dismantle the old ship. His appeal to American sentiment was successful; the ship was saved. Secretary Curtis Wilbur saved her again, but he did not want to ask Congress for money except for the ACTIVE navy, and so the task of raising funds was turned over to the school children of America.

Old Ironsides won 42 battles at sea, and never knew the bitter taste of defeat.

There are some who can't find a thrill in the restoration of the stout old ship to seaworthiness. We are sorry for them!

A little sentiment now and then, amidst the hard-boiled facts of life, is wholesome.

We believe the ruggedness of Old Ironsides is representative of our national character.

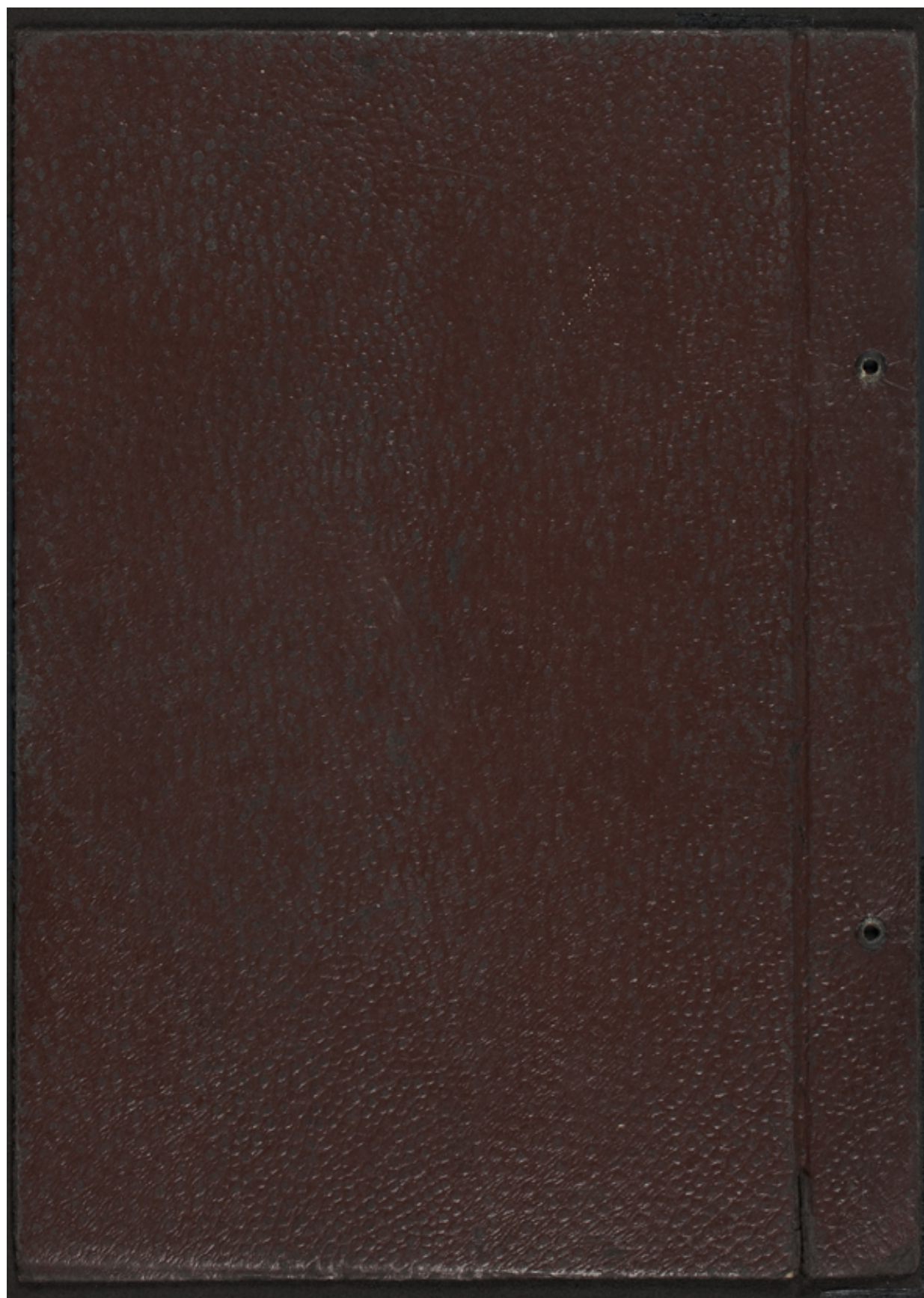
