Before I could get these, his ship ran aground and the crew was lost – alas.

Bill dies once more often than most men

My joy at learning that my beloved husband was alive did not last long. A few short months later I heard he had perished in a battle with the British ship, Java. So I was once more a widow. But young Daniel Robert (who I raised like my own son) trained as a lawyer. In 1819 he proved Bill and I were wed, and this won me the pay Bill was owed, and a navy pension!
